In the Name of God Amen

I Peter Levesque Widower of the parish of Saint Leonard Shoreditch in the County of Middlesex having my Body and Mind in good Condition I have thought it my duty to make this my Will and first I commend my Soul into the hands of my Creator who gave it me beseeching him to? me in his Grace through the merits of Jesus Christ and that my Body be interred in a devout manner in hope of a happy Resurrection that after my debts shall be paid I leave unto my **Grand Children** the produce of one thousand pounds in the three per cent consols equally share and share alike when they shall have attained the age of twenty one years or to their descendants. Item to the Church of St John ten pounds Sterling. Item to the Society of Lintot of which I am a Member 10 pounds Sterling. Item to **Madame Barbet** Door Keeper of the ? Church three pounds Sterling and the residue to my Executors namely **Magdalen Levesque** my daughter and **John Levesque** her husband. Done at London 19 April 1791 Signed - Pierre Levesque – Peter Baudry - James Beuzeville viz

Faithfully translated from the French Language at Doctors Commons London the nineteenth day of September 1800 by me Robt ? Notary Public.

This Will was proved at London the nineteenth day of September in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred before the Worshipful John Sorovll? Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the Right Honourable Sir William Wynne Knight also Doctor of Laws etc Master Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of **Magdalen Levesque** Widow the Daughter of the deceased and the surviving Executor named in the said will to whom administration of all and singular the Goods Chattels Credits of the said deceased was granted having both first sworn duty to Administer.

Buried 5th September 1800 at St Matthew Bethnal Green, no birth date or age given.
